Call for Abstracts

Abstracts may be submitted online at <http://www.mdanderson.org/conferences> for the Poster Session.

Deadline for abstract submission is Monday, January 5, 2009.

Limit poster abstracts to one single-spaced 8 1/2 x 11 page with 1/2" margins and font size no smaller than 10 point. Organize abstracts into four sections: Purpose, Methods, Results, and Conclusions. Define all abbreviations and provide three keywords describing the nature and content of the abstract. On a separate page, include the name of the conference, title of your presentation, and author's full name, highest degree, and institutional affiliation. Also, please include author's telephone, fax, and e-mail information. The conference executive committee will select abstracts for poster presentation based on scientific merit and content quality.

Abstracts will not be edited and will be published as received.

Freestanding 4' x 8' display boards will be provided for displaying the posters. If selected, you will receive a confirmation letter with detailed information for the Poster Session.

Medical Issues in Cancer Survivors

February 6–7, 2009

Goal

This conference is designed to enhance knowledge, skills, and performance of those clinicians taking care of cancer survivors. The conference will educate physicians on the management of internal medicine issues in cancer patients. In addition, it will also prepare them to face the challenges of providing non-oncologic services in an environment of reduced federal support for health care and a shirking medical workforce. This conference will bring together lead physicians to begin to create a model for an Internal Medicine Department associated with a cancer center.

Educational Objectives

After attending the conference, participants should be able to:

- identify some of the unique medical conditions that occur in cancer survivors;
- describe an appropriate workup and formulate a reasonable treatment plan for some of the common comorbid conditions that occur in cancer survivors;
- describe some of the challenges that clinicians face when providing care to cancer survivors; and
- describe some of the important components when creating a model for survivorship care.

Target Audience

This conference should be of value to medical oncologists, internal medicine, family medicine, advanced practice nurses, registered nurses, and other allied health care professionals.

Education Methods

Lectures, Question-and-Answer Sessions, Case Studies, Panel Discussions, Posters

Evaluation

A course evaluation form will provide participants with the opportunity to comment on the value of the program content to their practice decisions, performance improvement activities, or possible impact on patient health status. Participants will also have the opportunity to comment on any perceived commercial bias in the presentations as well as to identify future educational topics.
