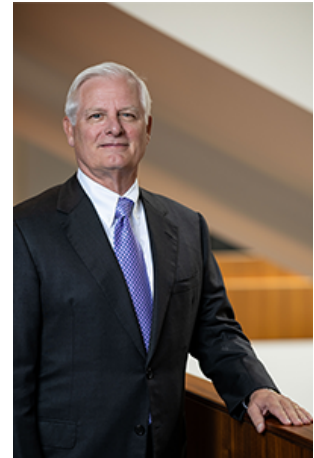


Board of Visitors (BOV) Members,

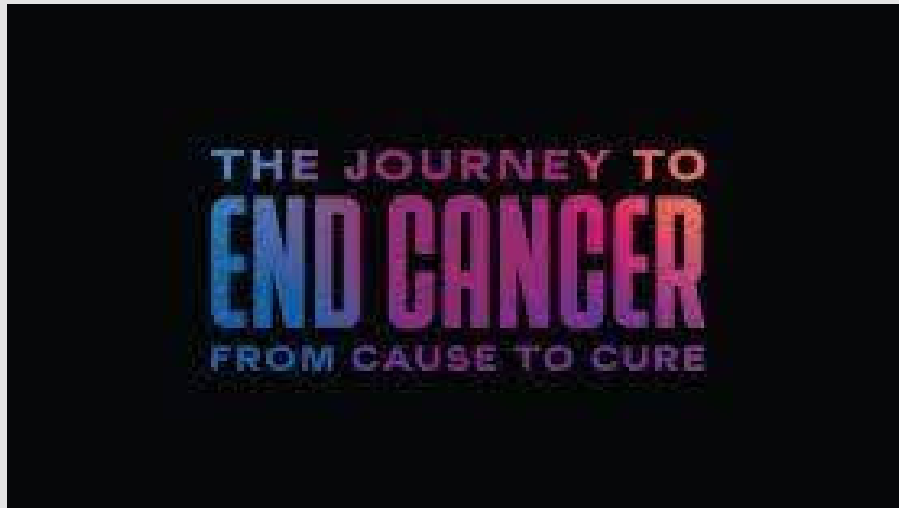
Now Open: Colorectal Center



UT MD Anderson has opened its new Colorectal Center, a groundbreaking clinical space redefining care for one of the most complex and deadly cancers. Designed to blend technology, thoughtful design and art, the space creates a calm, patient-centered environment that supports healing and reflection. With 27 exam rooms and five procedure rooms dedicated solely to colorectal cancer, the center expands access, deepens specialization and strengthens care for young-onset patients, who represent one-third of UT MD Anderson's colorectal cancer population.

The Cancer Neuroscience Program (CNP) Signature Priority Committee's February Lunch with Leaders highlighted major momentum in cancer–nervous system research. Faculty shared updates on UT MD Anderson's glioblastoma oncolytic virus trial and introduced the NeuroHealth Initiative, a new effort to better understand and prevent neurological side effects of treatment. The program also featured cutting-edge discoveries in tumor-nerve interactions and showcased CNP research presented at the 3rd Biennial International Cancer Neuroscience Symposium.
