# Blueprint for Impact

## Building the future of cancer care

Blueprint for Impact is MD Anderson's purposefully designed master facilities plan to shape the next era of cancer care and discovery. This plan optimizes our ability to navigate a dynamic market and embrace health care delivery models of the future.

Many of our current buildings were designed in an earlier era and no longer provide the space, technology or amenities that are suitable for the nation's premier cancer center.

MD Anderson must expand and modernize. Our plans include integration of world-class art and architecture to create healing environments that prioritize the patient experience.

New buildings are under construction in Houston, including:

- South Campus Research Building 5 (opening in 2027)
- Clinical Services Building (opening in 2028)
- MD Anderson Sugar Land (opening in 2029)
- Patient Care Building 1 (opening in 2030 or 2031)

Clinics will transition from multipurpose spaces to convenient, one-stop centers that focus on specific cancers. The first of these is a colorectal cancer clinic, followed by a prostate cancer clinic, offering a new model for providing personalized care.

MD Anderson is excited to pursue projects that improve the outlook for all patients touched by cancer. In 2026, Kinder Children's Cancer Center, a joint venture of UT MD Anderson and Texas Children's, will unite two preeminent institutions under one renowned cancer center. In 2031, we will open a comprehensive cancer center in Austin, which will help to meet the growing demand for our services in Central Texas.
