Leveraging the strengths of these two preeminent institutions, the center will accelerate drug discovery to fast-track the development of less toxic, more effective treatments; to expand access to more pediatric, adolescent and young adult patients than ever before; to provide holistic survivorship support; and to deliver robust education and training programs to the next generation of pediatric oncology specialists. This vision will take form through the construction of a world-class, purpose-built facility for pediatric cancer care, rising as a towering symbol of healing within the Texas Medical Center.
