Notes on the table

Each row contains information on two separate cohorts. Applications, offers and enrollment describe the class entering that September. Number completing and every destination column describe a different class — the one that entered two years earlier and finished that August. No figure to the right of the divider has any relationship to the enrollment figure beside it, and the two should never be divided into one another.

- * Applications are completed, and offers extended, during the academic year preceding the one shown, since recruitment for a September class runs through the prior year. Read left to right, the first three columns therefore follow one entering class from application through enrollment: the 55 applications and 4 offers in the 2022 row produced the class that began in September 2022.
- 1 Destination categories follow the sector of employment, consistent with Residency Standard 2.11 ("numbers in academics, clinical practice, industry positions"). Academic denotes a faculty appointment at a university or academic medical center. Clinical denotes clinical practice outside an academic appointment, such as a community hospital or private practice. Nearly all graduates of this program practice clinically; the distinction recorded here is the type of institution and appointment, not whether the work is clinical.
- 2 Destinations are recorded as the position held at the time of this statement. No graduate in this reporting window changed sector between first appointment and the present.
- 3 Number offered admission counts offers extended, including any declined by the candidate. It is not the number of available positions. Every offer in this period was accepted except one: for the class entering September 2026, a single candidate declined and the position was filled from the alternate list, giving five offers for four positions.

Program outcomes

Of the 17 graduates in this reporting period, 16 hold faculty appointments at academic medical centers and 1 practices at a community health system. Institutions represented include MD Anderson Cancer Center, the Medical College of Wisconsin, The Ohio State University College of Medicine, the University of Kansas Medical Center, the University of Miami, and the University of Oklahoma.

Thirteen of the 17 graduates in this period have taken Part 3 of the American Board of Radiology examination; the four who completed the program in August 2026 have not yet sat it. Of those thirteen, twelve passed unconditionally on the first attempt and one received a conditional pass and subsequently certified. All thirteen are board certified. National first-attempt unconditional pass rates were 67% in 2024 and 58% in 2023. No graduate of this program has failed Part 3.
