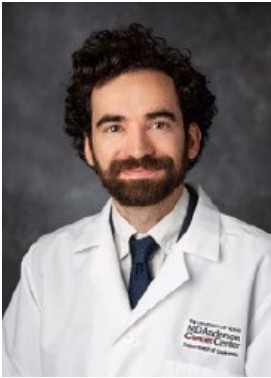

Ian Bouligny, MD is a first year Fellow in The Leukemia Fellowship Program at The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center, Department of Leukemia, joining in July 2023.

Dr. Bouligny's clinical and research interests include acute myeloid leukemia (AML) and acute lymphoblastic leukemia (ALL). He plans to pursue a career as a clinical investigator focusing on running clinical trials to bring novel therapeutic options to the field.

Dr. Bouligny completed his Hematology & Oncology fellowship at Virginia Commonwealth University Massey Cancer Center in Richmond, Virginia. Under the mentorship of Dr. Keri Maher, the director of the Acute Leukemia Program, and Dr. Steven Grant, the associate director for Translational Research, Dr. Bouligny deepened his focus on acute leukemia. Dr. Bouligny was recognized as the Leukemia Clinical Research Team Leader at VCU Massey Comprehensive Cancer Center from 2022-2023; his work in acute leukemia has been featured at numerous national conferences and many abstracts and publications. He was awarded a seat at the AACR/ASCO Methods in Clinical Cancer Research Workshop in 2022 as well as three Fellow's Scholarship awards during his fellowship. At the end of his fellowship, he was awarded the Outstanding Fellow Scholar award in the Department of Internal Medicine.

Dr. Bouligny's hobbies include graphic design, illustration, and a love for cooking — stemming from his roots in southern Louisiana. Dr. Bouligny is fluent in English and American Sign Language and can speak basic Spanish.
