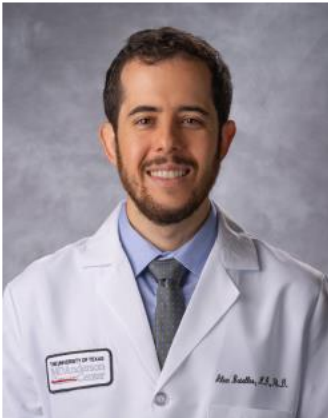

Alex Bataller, M.D., Ph.D. is a first year Fellow in The Leukemia Fellowship Program at The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center, Department of Leukemia. He plans to:

- Improve knowledge on the biology, diagnosis, management, and current treatments of hematological diseases such as leukemia, myelodysplastic syndromes and myeloproliferative neoplasms.
- Increase the current scientific knowledge about these diseases by actively participating in congress presentations and by writing scientific publications.
- Learn how a worldwide known institution such as MDACC works in an efficient way treating patients and developing and participating in clinical trials with novel treatments.

Dr. Alex Bataller obtained his medical degree from the University of Barcelona, Spain in 2014. Dr. Bataller performed the "MIR" exam to apply for residency programs, achieving the 66th best exam out of 12.000 aspirants.

Dr. Alex Bataller completed his residency training at Hospital Clinic of Barcelona where he served as a chief resident during his residency. After completing his residency training, Dr. Bataller has worked at the Stem cell biology, developmental leukemia, and immunotherapy laboratory of the Josep Carreras Leukemia Research institute. Dr. Alex Bataller has a master's degree in bone marrow transplantation at University of Valencia, and a master's degree in molecular oncology at University Rey Juan Carlos. Dr. Alex Bataller also is currently attending an online master of biostatistics and bioinformatics at Universitat Oberta de Catalunya.
