

Applicants must also have a minimum of 18 semester credit hours of upperdivision course work at 3000 for 4000 level.

Admissions for Fall 2018

Applicants to the one-year program in Histotechnology must complete a minimum of 90 semester credit hours of the Texas Core Curriculum and prerequisite coursework. The courses may be taken at any regionally accredited college/university and must be completed prior to enrollment in the School of Health Professions. Only courses with a grade of C- or better will be accepted. Courses are listed using the **Texas Common Course** Numbering System (www.tccns.org).
